COLLEGE

- Provides guidance on general education and college requirements
- Helps with academic planning and course selection
- Monitors progress toward graduation
- Supports with petitions, forms, and policy questions or exceptions
- Connects students to campus resources and opportunities

CAREER

- Offers resume and cover letter reviews
- Prepares students for interviews and job searches
- Provides career exploration and planning guidance
- Connects students with internships and job opportunities
- Host recruiting and networking events

MAJOR

- Advises on major-specific course requirements
- Assists with major planning and course sequencing
- Offers insight into research, internships, and department opportunities
- Approves major-related forms and substitutions
- Supports academic and career goals within the major

BSOS FELLER CENTER

The **Feller Center** in the College of Behavioral and Social Sciences is your co-located hub for **academic advising and career planning** services.

Your **BSOS college-level advising** helps students navigate university policies and serves as a first point of contact when you're not sure where to go. They can help with general education planning, understanding academic policies, and connecting students to the right campus resources. The Feller Center acts as a liaison between students and the broader university to support academic success.

Students can choose to meet **in person or virtually** with any of our college academic advisors listed in the [TerpEngage portal](#).

Some students like to select an advisor based on what time works best with their schedule and others select a person by their listed advising topics, who they met through orientation, UNIV, referrals, another advising experience, or any other reason. You can also view the [advisor biographies](#) to see if anyone resonates with you! You're also free to switch it up as your needs change.

BSOS career coaches can also help you explore career paths and internship options within the behavioral and social sciences, including how your major connects to various industries, graduate programs, and experiential opportunities.

YOUR DEPARTMENT

Your department (AKA your major) is the academic unit within BSOS that focuses on a **specific field of study**, such as Psychology, Economics, Government and Politics, or Criminology & Criminal Justice. At UMD, each BSOS department manages the courses, faculty, and requirements for its major or minor.

Departments help students with **major-specific** advising, course planning, research or internship opportunities, and career exploration within the field. They're the best place to go for guidance tailored to your academic and professional goals in your chosen discipline.
